



The Omaha Sports Commission (OSC) is proud to be inclusive in the events that we run and host. OSC does not discriminate in the delivery of programs or services during our events based on race, religion, gender/gender identity, sex, national origin, age, medical condition, handicap, veteran status, marital status, sexual orientation, or any other class protected by applicable law.

At times and by the nature of our industry, some events may specifically target participants of certain demographics. Events may have restrictions on participants, but attendees, fans, coaches, volunteers, or community programs would not follow the same stipulations. For example, hosting a 16 and under girls' volleyball tournament would only allow girls who are 16 years of age and younger to participate. A 'Senior' Games would restrict participation of a certain age and above, some being 35, 40 years of age and older. The LGBTQ Sports Championship is competition meant for individuals who identify within the LGBTQ community, and disabled veterans' games would be open to veterans who fall into this category. With event qualifications, athletes or teams that participate and compete may be restricted to ensure the integrity of the event.
