HALL OF FAME

To qualify for the Omaha Sports Hall of Fame, inductees must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Omaha Metropolitan Area native or individual who has lived in the metro area and participated in/around sports for at least four years. Omaha Metropolitan Area is defined as
 - Douglas County, NE
 - Sarpy County, NE
 - Washington County, NE

- Pottawattamie County, IA
- 2. Has achieved acclaim locally, with preferred regional or national acclaim.
- 3. Achievements must fall in one or more of the following categories
 - Competition

- Media
- Contributions Coaching
- 4. Must have achieved acclaim on one or more of the following levels:
 - Interscholastic
 - Intercollegiate
 - Professionally

AWARD NOMINEES

To qualify for an annual award, nominees must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Have an association to sports for a team or individually for at least one (1) year in the following geographical area(s):
 - Douglas County, NE
 - Sarpy County, NE
 - Washington County, NE

- Cass County, NE
- Pottawattamie County, IA
- 2. Has achieved acclaim locally for at least one (1) year, with possible regional or national acclaim.
- 3. Achievements must fall in one or more of the following categories
 - Competition

This can be for a one-time event from the past year or from cumulative, sustained service in the Omaha Metropolitan Area in Writing, Broadcasting, Photography, Public Relations, and/or Advertising.

Winners of this award are recognized for outstanding contribution(s) to the culture of athletics, competition, health and wellness, and sports entertainment in the Omaha Metropolitan Area from the previous year; or for cumulative, sustained contributions to the metropolitan area.
